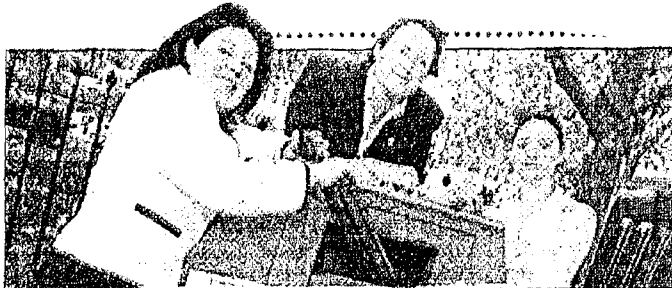
raise funds for Tommy's baby charity, which carries out research into pregnancy problems such as miscarriage. Lambeth's executive member for the environment,
