*'Ink Again'* –Meg recycles for charity

The scheme also re-cycles items which would otherwise have been thrown away and therefore helps the environment as well.'

Her standing as an MP, and her role as Deputy Minister for Women and Equality, will encourage others to support the valuable work Tommy's does. We believe every baby deserves the best start in life. The recycling scheme is managed by Environmental Business Products Limited (EBPL) who are experienced in the remanufacture of printer cartridges. Managing Director Pat Stead, says: 'It is great to have this senior-level of support from Meg Munn. Our scheme helps charities like Tommy's and helps the environment at the same time. There are still millions of cartridges being thrown into bins every year that could be recycled so we hope many more people in Sheffield will log onto [www.inkagain.co.uk](http://www.inkagain.co.uk) and ask for a free recycling bag'.
